

Common Testing Accommodations updated Feb 2024

The following is a non-exhaustive list of testing accommodations that are commonly requested and may be available for SOA examinations.

PLEASE NOTE: Requesting an accommodation from the list below does not guarantee you will receive the accommodation. Each request for accommodation is reviewed on an individualized, case-by-case basis. The SOA's decision whether to grant the accommodation request will be determined based on the information included in the candidate's Request for Accommodation Form and the supporting documentation submitted with the request.

- Ability to pace (walk around)
- Alternate non-Scantron answer sheet
- Braille version of examination
- Extended testing time
- Large print version of examination
- Marking answer choices in the test book
- Permission to bring and eat food and beverages. (water ok since May 2023).
- Permission to bring injectable medication, including injectable insulin: Use of injectable
 medication is permitted where necessitated by a disability. Candidates are required to
 submit a Request for Accommodation Form so that a separate testing room or other
 suitable area may be provided where the candidate can administer the medication in
 private.
- Private testing room
- Reserved or assigned seating location (e.g., seating near the exam proctor or away from the windows to minimize glare)
- Use of a book stand
- Use of a magnification devices (e.g., magnification reading glasses, handheld video magnifier, closed circuit television (CCTV), Zoom Text)
- Use of a podium



- Use of a reader
- Use of an amanuensis (scribe)
- Screen-readable HTML test (including, where applicable, use of screen reader software)
- Use of computer and printer for written-answer examinations
- Use of magnification devices (e.g., magnification reading glasses, handheld video magnifier, closed circuit television (CCTV), Zoom Text)
- Voice recognition software (e.g., Dragon)
- Wheelchair accessibility: If a table is requested, specify the height. Please note that SOA
 examinations are administered in numerous testing locations, including locations outside
 the United States. Candidates are required to submit a Request for Accommodation Form
 so that the SOA can ensure appropriate accessibility is provided. No medical
 documentation is required.
