In addition, I will contribute and assist in support of the educational and research needs of our profession.

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

I am a Consulting Actuary with the Mountain Gulf Health practice of Milliman and joined the firm in 2013. My expertise is in issues relating to the delivery and financing of healthcare and my current clients include health plans and HMOs – spanning startups, community affiliated plans, and provider-owned entities – healthcare providers including large health systems, care management vendors, and public and private employer groups.

Most recently I have led consulting engagements related to Medicare Advantage and Part D product development and pricing, evaluation of provider risk sharing arrangements, outcomes measurement and ROI evaluations for healthcare interventions, physician staffing and patient capacity analysis, employer group health benefit plan pricing, reserving, and forecasting, and several other ad hoc data-driven projects. I also recently co-authored a research report sponsored by the Society of Actuaries on the relatively new model of Direct Primary Care.

My passion is leveraging data, analytics, and sound actuarial judgement to support healthcare stakeholders as they consider and implement innovative and sustainable ways of delivering and financing healthcare services for vulnerable populations. This past year I certified Medicare Advantage and Part D bids for three community affiliated plans primarily focused on dual-eligible beneficiaries, led a multi-month outcomes evaluation of an in-home telemedicine program for chronically ill frail elderly patients, and my recent report on Direct Primary Care sheds light on a new model with a significant focus on the uninsured. Actuaries play an important role in evaluating, implementing, and monitoring innovative solutions targeted at improving outcomes and experiences for vulnerable populations, and I enjoy working with other healthcare stakeholders – including providers, payers, policymakers, and other actuaries – in this capacity.
